World History Description

- **Credit:** 1 History Credit. May be used as a Bible Course check-off. Can be used for English Grammar credit. QSU® totals in excess of 120 can apply toward other credit like grammar.
- **Description:** A Biblical view of world history will be the primary focus of this course. Biblical history and parallel world events will be understood in the light of Providential Purpose in all human events. Reading, writing and lecture methods will dominate course

World History Clinic Syllabus

- **Course Structure:** 10 week, double lecture class.
- **Portfolio Requirements:**
 - QSU Log® completed for all study & projects
 - Complete Class Lecture Notes Section (in order)
 - Audio Lecture Notes Section (by date heard)
 - Complete Outline of World History (or timeline)
 - Approved Reading Projects (logged)
 - Completed Essays (by date due)
- **Grade Composition:** Min. QSU® each week: 12
 - 20 points/week: QSU Log® completed each week
 - 300 points/week: Today's Class Notes (**3 QSU's/wk**)
 - 100 points ea: Audio Lecture Notes (1 QSU each)
 - 200 points ea: Complete Essays (**2 QSU's each 4 pp.**)
 - 3000 points: Outline of World History (**30 QSU's**)
 - 3000 points: Approved Reading Projects (**30 QSU'S**)
- **12,200 Total Possible Points for 120 QSU's. Extra QSU'S can transfer to another subject.**

Class Note Taking

- Notes are bulleted concepts, you must write out the detail for each bullet.
- Use key words as leaders, explain in concise but complete sentences.
- Ask questions when you lose the lecture's focus, this will help you and those on DVD usage.
- Notes will be graded increasingly harder from week to week.
- Be neat and structured, keep in binder in order.

Audio-cassette Note Taking

- Notes are your responsibility, no handouts.
- Listen carefully, use key words as leaders, explain in concise but complete sentences.
- You should have reduced the lecture to an outline that you could orally present or write and essay from.
- Notes will be graded increasingly harder from week to week.
- Be neat and structured, keep in binder by date.

Essay Requirements

- Essays should be 4-5 pages for each class (2 QSU®'s)
- Essays will be written from your choice of class notes, audio notes, or reading assignments.
- There is a minimum of 10 essays due.

Outline of History Project Requirements

- Each student is required to complete an outline of world history, or a timeline of world history.
- The Central outline or timeline framework must be Bible history.
- A minimum of 3 QSU®'s should be completed each week.
- Quality will determine grade, completeness will determine QSU®'s. Keep time log. A total of 30 QSU®'s required for this project.

Reading Project Requirements

- Minimum Requirements:
 - 450 pages from standard, approved textbook level.
 - Reading resources will be available from instructor, or student may submit alternative assignment which must be approved individually.
 - QSU® Log required to show amount of reading and time spent reading.
 - Outlining and Note-taking may be helpful if student wishes to use required reading to write essays. Essays should have a general interpretative approach.
