

## Eternal Impact: Daniel 4

### A Notesheet for Lesson 5 of Applied Citizenship 101

#### **Truth 1** God gives authority to whomever He \_\_\_\_\_ (4:17; 25:32)

Daniel 4 is the personal \_\_\_\_\_ of King Nebuchadnezzar's relationship with God, and how God both humbled and exalted him (4:2).

It is a universal truth that God ordains the leadership of a nations, \_\_\_\_\_ of time, place, or type of government (4:3).

#### **Truth 2** The Christian citizen speaks \_\_\_\_\_ to his authorities, even when it is difficult to do so (4:19).
